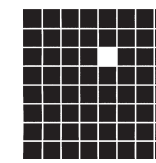

**Maryland ACEP Business Meeting**

**1:30 – 2:00**            **Pitfalls in Orthopedic Radiology**

*Presenter: Michelle Lin, MD, FACEP*

Dr. Lin will discuss how to read the wrist, elbow, pelvis, knee and foot films. Subtle high-risk traumatic injuries, which are easily missed on plain radiograph findings, will be discussed. Subtle fractures in the pelvis and extremities on plain radiographs will be identified taking into consideration the limitations of x-rays in identifying traumatic pathology.

**2:00 – 2:30**            **When Tickers Start to Flicker: Pacemaker Malfunction**

*Presenter: Kevin Reed, MD, FACEP*

Over 112,000 new pacemakers are implanted yearly and an additional 25,000 replacement procedures (majority due to battery depletion) are performed. Patients with pacemaker malfunction can present with numerous, often vague symptoms including palpitations, syncope, dizziness, chest pain, dyspnea, or fatigue. Dr. Reed will discuss the ABC's of normal pacemakers and the ability to diagnose clinically significant abnormal pacemaker function.

**2:30 – 3:00**            **Toxicology Myths and Pseudomyths**

*Presenter: Andrew Stolbach, MD, FACEP*

Dr. Stolbach will discuss concepts that have been handed down in toxicology as axioms that sometimes aren't supported by the data. He will present contraindications to beta blocker administration in cocaine poisoning and pathophysiology and treatment of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Dr. Davis will present an evidenced-based approach to the “cannot” miss emergency urological conditions that may be encountered in the ED setting. The primary focus will be on differentiating emergencies from less urgent conditions, as well as safely and effectively managing the patient presenting with an “acute scrotum.”
