

Dr. Kerry Forrestal began his career in emergency services at age 16 with his local ambulance corps and became one of the youngest certified EMTs in New York at age 18. He earned his undergraduate degree in Biology and Psychology from Binghamton University and later got an MBA before pursuing medicine at Stony Brook University School of Medicine.

He completed his Emergency Medicine residency at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital and is a Fellow of the American College of Emergency Physicians. For more than 20 years, Dr. Forrestal has worked as an emergency physician in trauma centers and currently serves as an Emergency Department Medical Education Director.

Dr. Forrestal has participated in international medical missions, helped develop EMS initiatives abroad, and teaches in the health sciences at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore.
